(This assignment consists of three different scenarios, and we were to read each scenario, then respond with a letter or email to the appropriate party)

Crewes_case 1

*Before responding to this email, I would have to know if the student was given time during the school day to work on the online class. I am assuming that one period of this student's day is devoted to the online class and that student has the entire period to work on that class. If this is truly the situation, I would respond as follows:

Dear Mr. Smith,

Thank you for taking the time to contact me. I appreciate your concerning in the progress your son is making in his online class. This email would go to all students:
